ASSEMBLY BILL 1039 Equitable Access to State Grants

SUMMARY

AB 1039 will require State agencies to provide nonprofit organizations up to 25% of funds in advance for all new contracts and grants starting in January 1, 2026. The bill will also increase transparency by requiring the existing State Grants Portal to list available advance pay opportunities and their amounts.

The bill addresses a critical equity and access issue by providing nonprofits with the needed start-up funds for essential community services.

BACKGROUND

Nonprofits often struggle with the State's reimbursement model, which is a condition for securing state funds. The passage of AB 590 (Hart, Chapter 535, Statutes of 2023) paved the way for fair and equitable access to State grants and contracts by allowing advance payments for up to than 25% of total awarded funds. This critical reform addressed cash flow issues for many nonprofits, reducing financial strain as nonprofits continue to provide services.

In <u>CAL FIRE's Advance Payment Report</u> (Public Resources Code 705.5) to the Legislature, the agency found that advance payments for the Forest Health and Wildfire Prevention Grants program were essential in funding fire-prevention projects and forest management in wildfire-prone communities.

These funds covered immediate expenses, such as staff, utilities, contractors and other costs for nonprofits participating in the program. Some grantees reported that they would have been unable to "afford to fund the work without these advances."

PROBLEM

While many agencies have utilized the option to offer nonprofits up to 25% in advance payment, many others have not. This deters under-resourced communities from even applying for state-funded projects due to a lack of up-front capital. This creates inconsistency and uncertainty for nonprofits, many of which rely on predictable cash flow in to deliver important services.

Smaller and under resourced nonprofits continue to face a difficult choice: endure financial strain by taking on high-interest loans to cover start-up costs, or delay or scale back programs in order to access state funds.

SOLUTION

AB 1039 builds on the success and proven model of AB 590 (Hart) by requiring all new State grants and contracts to offer up to 25% of the funds in advance starting January 01, 2026.

The bill will promote greater transparency and efficiency by requiring the State Grants Portal, request for proposals, and contracts to specify that advance pay is available and the amount offered.

AB 1039 reaffirms California's commitment to supporting its nonprofit partners in strengthening our communities.
